MISSION

The Ottawa Grace Manor is a Christian faith-based long-term care home providing residents with high quality care.

ORGANIZATION

The Salvation Army, an integral part of the Christian church, is an international movement (located in more than 100 countries) motivated by love for God and a practical concern for mankind. In 1904, the Salvation Army established a home for unmarried mothers on Daley Avenue, in Ottawa. In 1922, the home for unmarried women changed its location, and became a hospital for women at the corner of Parkdale and Wellington, which over time became the Grace Hospital. A need for restructuring within the Ontario Health Care system resulted in the Salvation Army Ottawa Grace Manor being built in 2002, replacing the Grace Hospital. The Salvation Army Ottawa Grace Manor is governed by a Board of Governance in conjunction with The Salvation Army (Ontario Division) Divisional Headquarters. Ottawa Grace Manor is licensed with the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care, and has been granted accreditation by Accreditation Canada (2022-2025).

Ottawa Grace Manor (OGM) has five resident home areas with either 25 or 26 beds on each, for a total of 128 residents. The home area on the first floor (**Gladstone**) is a secure unit for residents with wandering tendencies. The two home areas on the second floor are **Queens** and **Parkdale** and the two home areas on the third floor are **Wellington** and **Rosemount**. Each home area is self-contained with its own dining, laundry and activity rooms as well as a nursing station.

Balconies are located off the dining rooms on the second and third floors. A secure garden area is maintained by volunteers and contains tables, chairs and gliders.



MANAGEMENT CONTACTS

NURSING

Nursing caregivers are made up of Registered Nurses (RNs), Registered Practical Nurses (RPNs) and Personal Support Workers (PSWs). Twenty-four-hour nursing care is provided for all residents.

Each home area is staffed as follows:

Days: 1 RPN, 4 PSWs

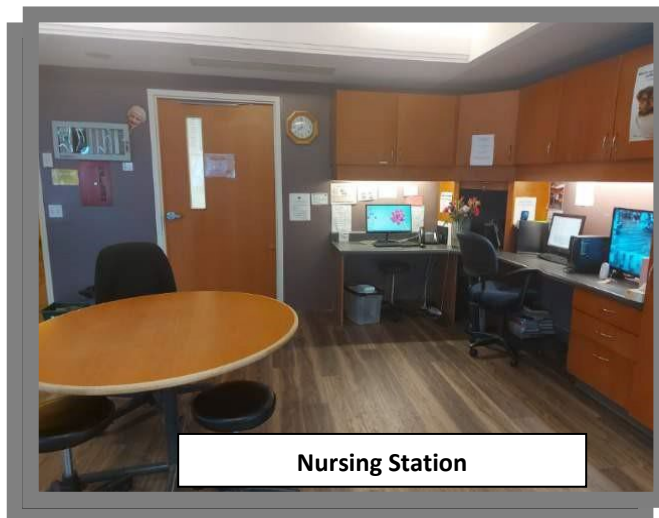
Evenings: 1 RPN, 3 PSWs

Nights: 1 PSW

In addition to the above staffing levels:

1 RN floats the building 24 hours a day

1 RPN and 2 PSWs float the building from 11pm-7am



Personal Support Workers assist with daily activities of living, moving through a routine familiar to the resident. Our "doing with" approach is designed to enhance the opportunity to make meaningful choices and ensure individualized care for each resident.

Medications are administered by the Registered Nursing staff at scheduled times as prescribed by the attending physician.

Attending physicians visit the Manor weekly. Each resident is visited by the physician a minimum of quarterly, and a physician is on-call 24 hours a day. Residents may choose to keep their physician from the community upon the physician's agreement to sign a contract with Ottawa Grace Manor.

Baths and showers are offered twice a week (more frequently if necessary) and are supervised by nursing staff. We employ both male and female nursing staff and preferences for male or female attendants for personal services will be taken into consideration and accommodated when able.

Call bells are provided in each bedroom and washroom for residents' use.



FOOD SERVICES

Individual needs of residents are assessed to determine meal satisfaction, dietary sufficiency, and to review special dietary needs. (i.e. pureed and minced textures; thickened fluids; gluten-free and vegetarian diets). Substitutes and choices can be accommodated where health and availability permit.

Resident Food Committee meetings are held monthly, to review menus, sample various food items and make suggestions based on likes and dislikes. The menu changes seasonally and is rotated on a four-week cycle.

Meal times:

Breakfast 8:30 am

Lunch 12:00 pm

Supper 5:00 pm

In addition to three meals daily, residents enjoy nourishing snacks and beverages in the morning, afternoon and evening.

Families and friends are encouraged to participate in cooking, baking, and dining experiences, and to utilize the facilities provided in the resident home areas. The servery in the City of Ottawa Community Room is also available for use. Families and visitors are invited to dine with residents during meal times. Meal tickets can be purchased at the reception desk for \$5.00 per meal.

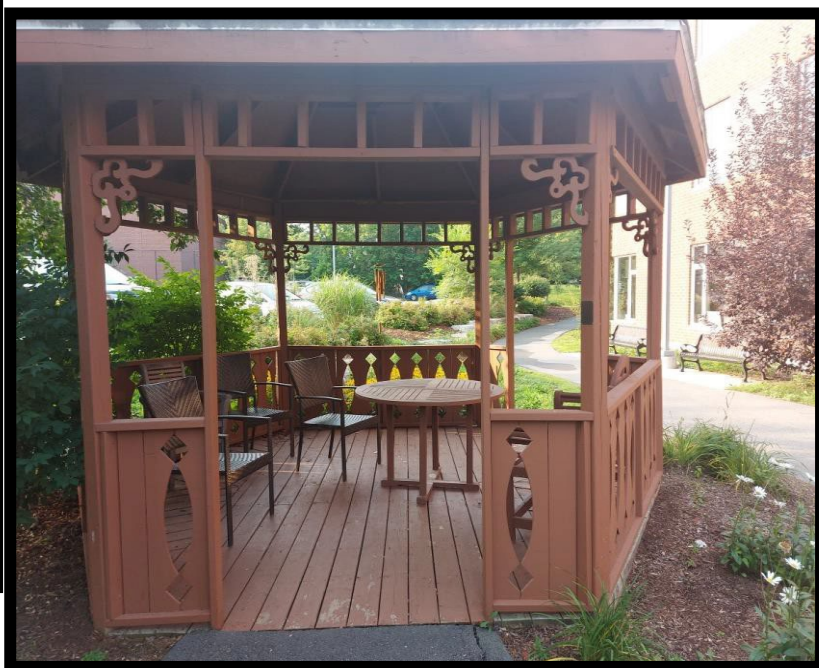
Special events such as BBQs, picnics, garden parties and candlelight dinners are held regularly. Family members are welcome!

Monthly activity calendars are available at the front desk and are also posted outside the activity rooms on the home areas and on the bulletin boards across from the elevators. At the beginning of each month the activity calendar and the monthly newsletter are delivered to each resident's room.





SPIRITUAL CARE

Ottawa Grace Manor's Spiritual Care Department assists people in drawing upon their own religious beliefs and spiritual resources as they face challenges or crises.

Residents receive regular pastoral visits for emotional and spiritual support. A Chaplain is available to provide counseling and support to residents, families, staff, and volunteers and to conduct funeral/memorial services for residents.

A "Quiet Room" is located in the corner of the vestibule area on the main floor for the purpose of quiet reflection, spiritual renewal, and prayer. There is a locked prayer box in this room which is checked regularly by the Director of Spiritual Care.

Spiritual Care Activities:

- * Sunday Chapel Service conducted weekly on alternating home areas.
- * Liturgy of the Word is celebrated on the fourth Wednesdays of the month.
- * Communion is offered weekly.
- * Services are held twice a year to commemorate residents and associates.
- * The Salvation Army Band visits the Manor on the first Sunday of each month.



PLACEMENT COORDINATOR

The Placement Coordinator facilitates pre-admissions, transfers, and discharges from the Manor.

ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES (Maintenance, Housekeeping & Laundry)

Laundry services are provided for all residents, with the exception of dry cleaning and other specialized cleaning services. Housekeeping staff label and launder clothing at no extra cost.

Each resident home area has a laundry room equipped with a domestic washer, dryer, a sink, soap and iron/ironing board. Residents and families are welcome to make use of these facilities to enhance a "homelike" and familiar experience for the residents. Laundry facilities are available to all residents and family members between 3:00 pm and 10:00 pm **only**.

All bed sheets and linens (towels, etc.) are sent out to be washed; Ottawa Grace Manor has contracted services with an external company.

The common areas of the Manor (i.e., dining rooms, hallways and lounge areas) are air conditioned during the summer months.

While our philosophy is to encourage residents to do as much for themselves as they are able, cleaning of Residents' rooms are provided by housekeeping services, with some assistance from nursing staff.

FINANCIAL

Ottawa Grace Manor prefers that the resident accommodation rate be electronically withdrawn monthly. A statement will be sent monthly to the billing contact, itemizing what was withdrawn from the resident's account.

Trust Accounts can be opened for residents to cover hair appointments, outings, etc. The Trust Account gives residents access to their finances through the Business Office at the Manor. The amounts to be placed in a Trust Account depend on resident spending patterns. The Trust Account can be accessed during business hours, Monday to Friday.

RESIDENT SERVICES AND INFORMATION

ALCOHOL

Family and visitors are not permitted to bring alcohol onto OGM premises for any reason. In accordance with organizational philosophy, alcoholic beverages are only given when prescribed by the attending physician for medicinal purposes and are administered by registered nursing staff.

FAMILY & FRIENDS COUNCIL (FFC)

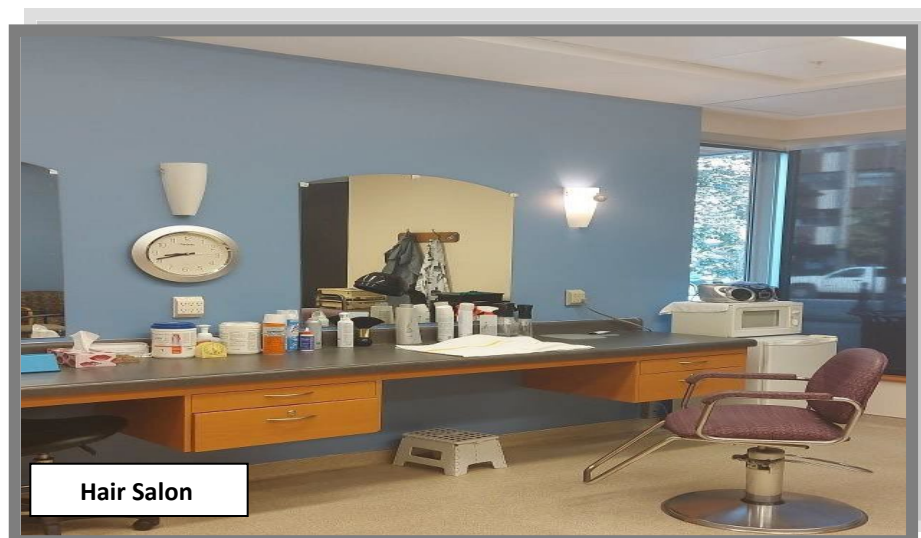
The Family and Friends Council meet each month for advocacy and support services, educational sessions, discussions of issues, problem solving and recommending improvements. MAIL

Ottawa Grace Manor receives mail daily Monday to Friday. It is delivered to the Home Area for residents. Resident's outgoing mail with postage affixed may be dropped off at the Reception Desk.

MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN DYING (MAiD)

The Salvation Army is committed to the inherent dignity of every human being throughout the entire continuum of life. MAiD will not be provided at The Salvation Army Ottawa Grace Manor. Salvation Army care providers will sensitively and respectfully address a resident's request for information about MAiD. The Salvation Army will permit the assessment process to take place in The Salvation Army facility to determine if the patient/resident meets the legislated eligibility requirements for MAiD. This process will follow all legislative guidelines as set forward by the government and local health authority. Residents who meet the MAiD criteria and who wish to proceed with MAiD will be referred through their physician or the local health authority to an alternate health facility or private location that will accommodate their request.

PARKING

Free parking is available for visitors in the south parking lot. All visitors are required to record their license plate number when signing in at the Reception Desk.

PHARMACY

Ottawa Grace Manor contracts pharmaceutical needs through MediSystem Pharmacy. All residents are required to use the pharmacy contracted by the Manor. Residents are responsible for payment of medications that are not covered by OHIP or the resident's private insurance plan.

REHABILITATION SERVICES

The physiotherapist assesses each resident upon admission and provides physiotherapy based on what is required/funded by OHIP. Strengthening and exercise classes are held regularly, and equipment such as exercise bikes and weights are available without charge. If personal devices and equipment are required, they are the financial responsibility of each resident.

RESIDENT COUNCIL

Residents meet monthly to raise and discuss concerns or suggestions related to life at the Manor. Residents may volunteer to sit on various committees in the Manor and/or to be general members of the Resident Council.

RESIDENT'S PERSONAL ITEMS

Ottawa Grace Manor understands and respects the rights of all residents to bring in their own personal belongings. However, items must not impede the nursing staff or others when delivering care to residents. Floors must be kept clear in order to permit the use of lifts, wheelchairs, etc. Should you have any questions, please check with the Director of Operations.

RESTORATIVE NURSING

Restorative nursing is a creative and collaborative process that has been adopted by OGM. It covers nursing interventions that promote the residents' ability to adapt and adjust to living as independently and safely as possible by focusing on physical, mental and psycho-social functions. The Restorative Care RPN evaluates and determines the suitability of residents who may benefit from this initiative. The PSWs are trained and supervised in order to implement the program with the residents. Measurable objectives, interventions and evaluations must be documented in each resident's care plan and in the clinical record.

RESTRAINTS

The use of physical and chemical restraints is not consistent with the philosophy of Ottawa Grace Manor, or the Patient Restraint Minimization Act 2001. Restraints are not used unless determined necessary as a last resort by Registered Nursing Staff and the Medical Director. Powers of Attorney are consulted. With the exception of an emergency, a Doctor's Order and Consent will be obtained prior to use of a restraint.

SMOKING

Ottawa Grace Manor is a smoke-free home, and no tobacco products are allowed in resident rooms or on the property. OGM does not permit cigarettes, nicotine inhalers or e-cigarettes to be stored on site. Any nicotine products would need to be brought in each time by family or friends when visiting. Residents wanting to use a tobacco product must be able to do so safely, off premises, without the assistance of staff. When applicable, residents will be assessed for safe smoking habits prior to admission.

SPECIALIZED SERVICES (EXTERNAL SOURCES)

To minimize inconvenience to residents, several in-house services are offered at OGM on a regular basis. Arrangements for these services can be made through the registered nursing staff. Residents are billed directly for these services which cover:

- Audiology (hearing tests, dispensing and repairing hearing aids and accessories)
- Dental (check-ups, cleaning and minor dental procedures. Residents requiring sedation or more extensive work attend the Dental Clinic at the Civic Campus of the Ottawa Hospital)
- Foot-Care (specialized nurses provide care for diabetics, ingrown toenails, etc.)
- Optometry (routine eye exams, optical and eyewear needs)

TELEPHONE/CABLE/INTERNET

Grace Manor has cable television and internet services that residents may purchase for their room. Grace Manor does not provide resident telephone service. Telephone services must be purchased from an external telephone company.

TUCK SHOP

The Tuck Shop is open, on weekly basis, in the front lobby. Items for sale include stamps, cards, coffee, chips, chocolate bars, candy, etc. Snack and drink vending machines are located on the main floor and are available 24 hours a day.

VOLUNTEERS

Volunteer membership is open to family or other people interested in becoming part of our volunteer base. Training is provided by Grace Manor staff. Volunteers are an integral part of the Grace Manor family and their presence enhances the quality of life for the residents by providing companionship, assisting with feeding, maintaining the garden and helping with activities and outings. All volunteers must undergo police check for the vulnerable sector. Inquiries can be directed to Carrie at ext. 135.

VISITING

Specific guidelines and practices are enforced, for all visitors, in order to keep our residents and staff safe. All visitors will be asked to answer and sign the Covid-19 Screening Tool and Sign-In Sheets prior to entering the units.

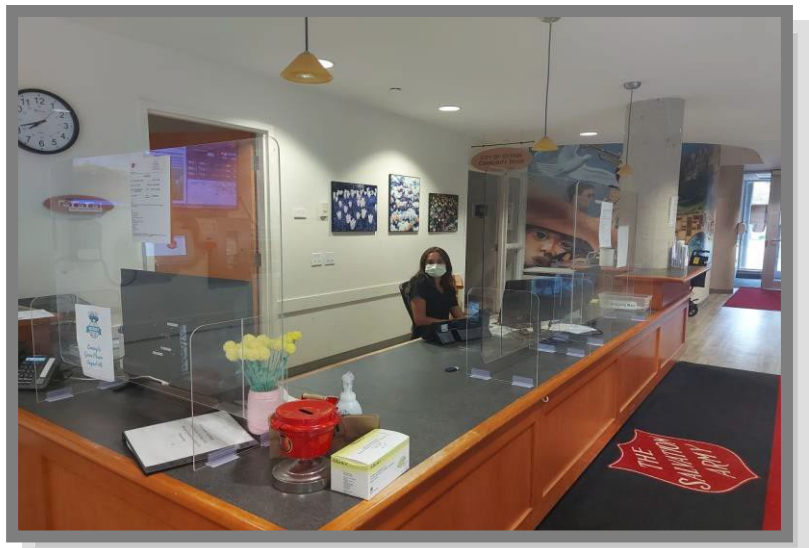
Masks are currently mandatory when visiting indoors. No cloth masks are permitted. Visitors will be given a procedure mask at the front door.

Visitors can arrive as early as 8 am. We do not have a departure time limit; however, we do ask that visitors respect the sleeping times of their loved ones.

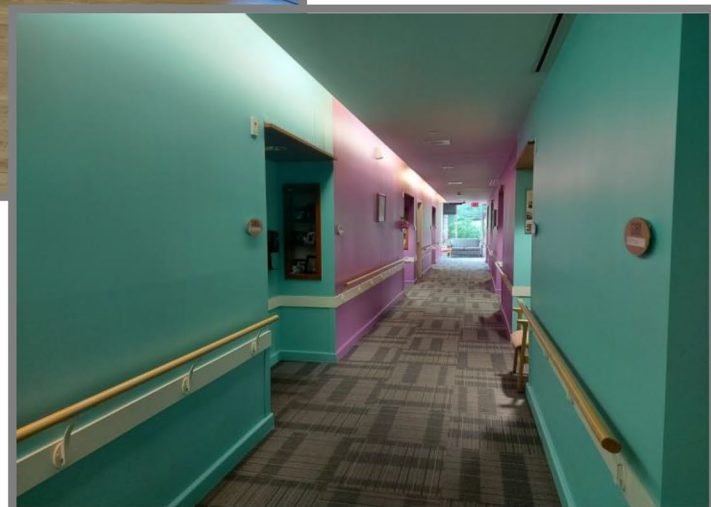
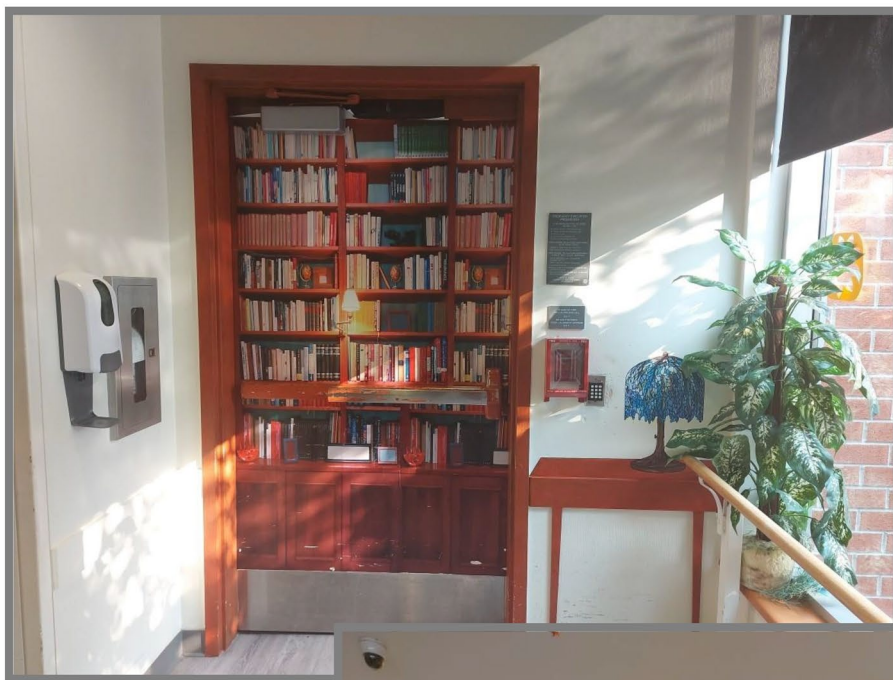


Main Lobby

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS:

1. How many rooms are private accommodations and how many are basic accommodations?

Ottawa Grace Manor has a total of 128 residents. There are 76 private accommodations (one bedroom with a private bathroom) and 52 basic accommodations (two bedrooms with a shared bathroom).

2. Which equipment do the residents have access to?

The residents have access to the following equipment (some equipment may involve an additional cost to the residents):

- ♦ any equipment necessary to assist with transferring (i.e., lifts)
- ♦ any equipment necessary to prevent skin breakdown (i.e., therapeutic mattresses)
- ♦ any equipment deemed necessary by an occupational therapist to enhance independence and quality of life. (i.e., adaptive utensils)

3. What types of activities are available for residents?

Two activity calendars are produced each month. One is for Gladstone (first floor) and is geared towards residents with moderate to severe impairments. The second version outlines the activities planned for residents on the second and third floors.

4. Do residents participate in physical activities?

Chair and strength exercise classes (for residents who meet the criteria) are held twice weekly by the Physiotherapy and Life Enrichment Department. Some residents may be admitted into the restorative program by nursing.

5. How often do residents receive baths or showers?

All residents are offered a minimum of two baths or showers per week.

6. Do you offer overnight stays for out-of-town family members?

We have a cot that is available for family members to use if their loved one is ill or palliative. Currently, we do not have a guest room available.

7. Do you offer a day program to the community?

We do not offer a day program as we are not funded to do so.

8. Do you share areas of your building with the community for other functions?

We often let community organizations use our City of Ottawa Community Room, upon approval of the Executive Director-particularly for educational seminars or events of benefit to the staff and residents. Cost for room bookings is determined on a case-by-case basis. (Currently suspended due to COVID-19)

9. How large are the building and the resident rooms?

The Manor's three-story building has a total area of 92,377 gross square footage. Each Private Accommodation has a bedroom of 150 square feet, a private washroom of 52 square feet and a closet of 6 square feet. Each Basic Accommodation has a bedroom of 140 square feet, a shared washroom of 52 square feet, a vestibule of 43 square feet and a wardrobe of 6 square feet.

10. Do residents have to change doctors when they move into Grace Manor?

Residents may keep their current doctor from the community, as long as the doctor is willing to sign a contract with the Manor. This contract includes but is not limited to requesting that the doctor come to the Manor to visit the resident, and that the doctor be on call 24 hours a day.

11. How long is the wait list?

The Champlain Local Health Integration Network's (LHIN's) mandate is to ensure health services are well-organized, appropriately funded and meet the health needs of the 1.3 million residents who call this region home. The LHIN manages the waiting list for all Long-Term Care Homes.

The wait list for admission to the Ottawa Grace Manor is constantly changing; therefore, we cannot give an exact or approximate waiting time. We recommend that you check with the Champlain Home and Community Care Support Services (HCCSS) at 310-2222 or 1-800 538-0520 (toll free) to monitor your loved one's position on the waiting list.

12. Is respite/short stay care available?

All of Ottawa Grace Manor's beds are long-term care beds; respite / short stay / convalescent care is not available.

13. What if a resident is admitted to Gladstone but does not require placement in this unit?

New residents are observed and assessed within six weeks of admission. If they do not require the secure feature offered by Gladstone, they will be transferred to another unit when a bed becomes available.

14. Is Palliative Care available?

Yes. Palliative Care is a multidisciplinary approach to specialized medical and nursing care for people with life-limiting illnesses. It focuses on providing relief from the symptoms, pain, and physical and mental distress at any stage of illness. At OGM, our goal is to improve the quality of life and provide support for both the residents and their families.

15. What is the status of staff retention?

We strive to ensure that Grace Manor's Human Resource management and programs, systems, policies and procedures support the potential of the organization's greatest asset-its people.

We have over 188 dedicated staff at Grace Manor, of whom 15 are original employees from opening day on September 18, 2002. Additionally, there are 24 staff with over fifteen years of service, and another 19 with more than ten years of service. In summary, over 30% of our staff have been employed at Grace Manor for ten years or more.

16. Does Grace Manor conduct satisfaction surveys?

Since 2013, we have conducted annual resident, family and employee satisfaction surveys to gauge satisfaction levels and to identify areas for improvement. Grace Manor also conducts Admission, Care Conference and Employee Orientation Surveys. We are always striving to provide the best care to the residents, as well as providing a safe, pleasant work environment for our employees.

AFFORDING LONG-TERM CARE

If a resident's income (after taxes) is not sufficient to pay for the Basic Accommodation Rate, there is a subsidy available to reduce only the Basic Accommodation Rate. Ottawa Grace Manor's Business Office will work with the family to complete the rate reduction application form. The reduced rate application for a Basic Accommodation must include a copy of the most recent Notice of Assessment from Revenue Canada. The resident must file an Income Tax Return to Revenue Canada in order to obtain a Notice of Assessment.

COSTS OF ACCOMMODATION

Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care (MOHLTC) sets the accommodation rates for Long Term Care (LTC) homes. Long Term Care homes are required to provide at least 30 days written notice of a proposed increase in accommodation rates and the amount of the proposed increase. The MOHLTC provides funding for homes. The amount paid by residents for their accommodation is referred to as the “co-payment”.

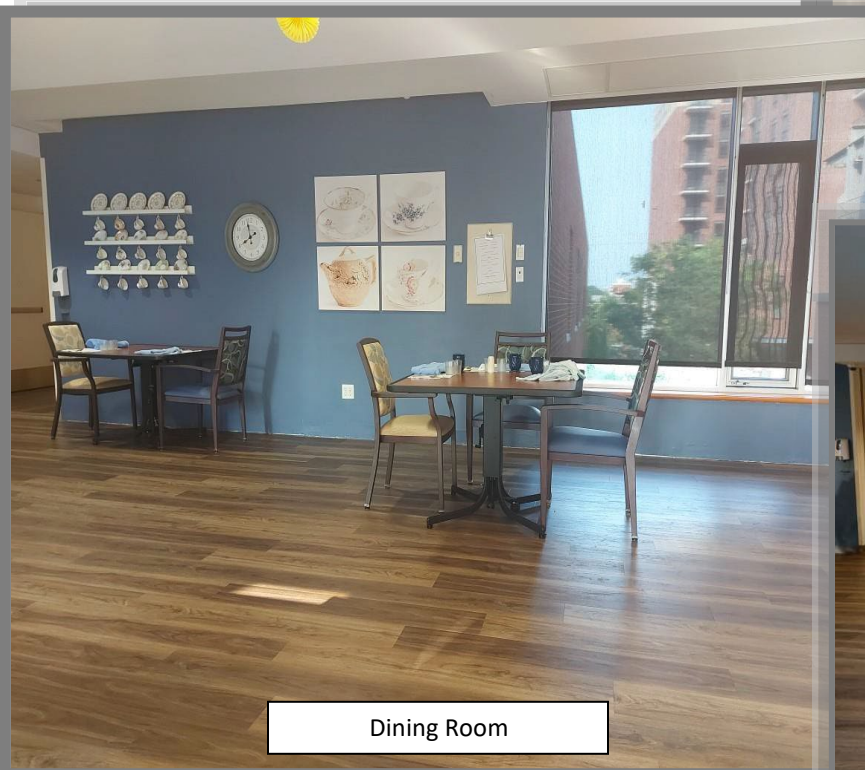

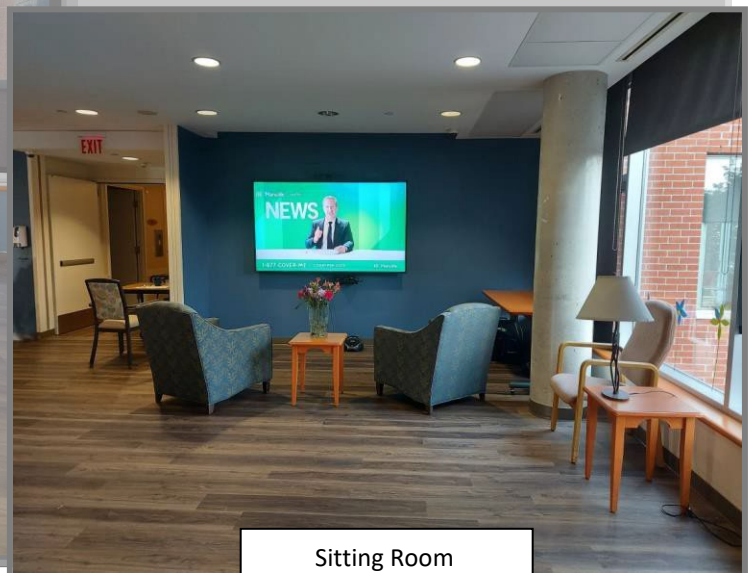
Basic Accommodation Bedroom

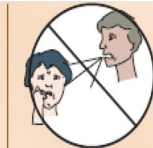

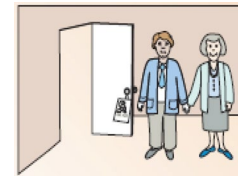
